

#### How students are assessed

- √ Assessments are carried out through assignments, coursework and an external examination (25%).

- √ Witness statements and observations from tutors and qualified professionals.

#### Work based experience

A range of learning methods and assessments are used to support students in gaining valuable experiences within the Child Care sector. Working in partnership with Birkenhead Early Excellence, students participate in weekly, practical work based sessions, lead by highly qualified early years professionals.
